

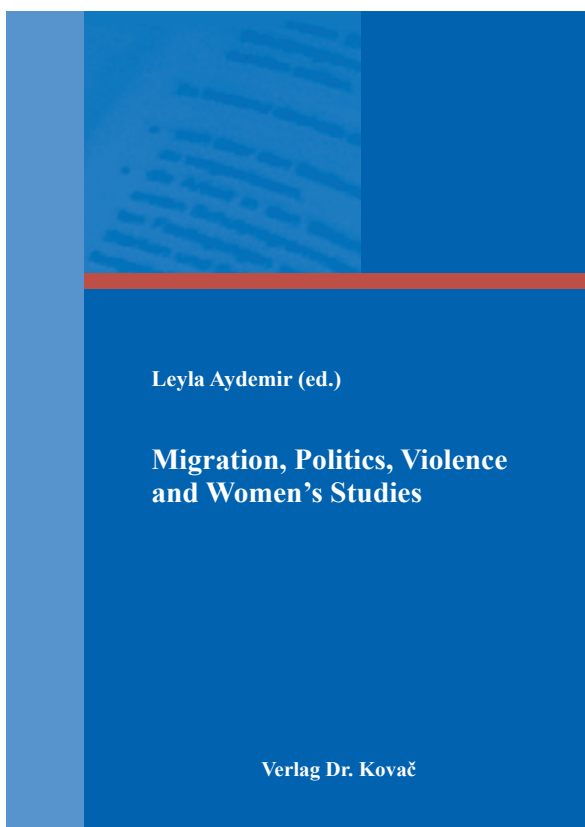

PREFACE
